P: When God's people were surrounded by hardship, suffering, and grief, Isaiah proclaimed, The spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn; to provide for those who mourn in Zion—to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit (Isaiah 61:1-3a).

A: We come today as people who are also surrounded by suffering and grief. And yet, the Spirit hovers among us, tending and anointing, inspiring freedom where there is captivity, declaring blessing in places the world has cursed, and igniting fierce joy where mourning and heartache prevail.

C: We wait as people who experience hardship and pain, yet we are called to witness to the persistent joy that sustains our life as God's people.

P: We light these candles as signs of our shocking hope, just peace, and fierce joy. May our lives shine with the fierce, tenacious joy of the Light who lives in our hearts as we wait and work for the coming of God's kingdom on earth as it is in heaven.

SCENE TWO

TEACHER: Time for Earth Gazing! You will each write a paragraph on your observations for Homework.

SHINY: I see a herd of elephants in Africa!

SILVER: I've got North America in focus tonight. What a huge country and so few people! Wait... I see a village! It must be dinner time. Looks good!

WISHING: All right! I get the Arctic tonight! Polar bears and ice and snow!

FALLING: Wow! I am looking at Australia. Look at all the kangaroos!

GOLD: I see the highest mountains on Earth! They are so tall!

NORTH: Look! It's the North Pole! I see Santa Claus!

LITTLE: There's Rudolph!

TWINKLE: I've got Bethlehem tonight. I can see a couple traveling by donkey. They look happy but they look very tired. They must be going into the city. Bethlehem is full of travelers tonight! I hope that they can find a place to stay.

SHINY: Trust Twinkle to find something boring to watch. I'll stay with my elephants.

SCENE THREE

TEACHER: School is out for tonight. Get a good day's rest so you can shine brightly tomorrow night. Twinkle, maybe you should try some new fuses.

SHINY: Maybe she should try sugar!

TEACHER: No cheating, Shiny! Is that why you've been so bright lately?

SHINY: I don't need to – I'm just naturally brilliant!

TEACHER: Has everyone completed their homework?

SHINY: It's not very good because the dog ate it.

TEACHER: I think I'm getting a Triple Asteroid Headache. Ok, class. Let's sing our opening song.

ALL: Twinkle, twinkle, little star. How I wonder what you are.

TEACHER: SHINY! One more rubber band and it's detention for 2 months! How brightly can you shine tonight, class? To your places and begin shining.

Shiny – 480 Watts. Silver – 450 Watts. Gold – 420 Watts. Falling – 400 Watts.

Wishing – 400 Watts. North – 350 Watts. Little – 300 Watts. Twinkle – 75 Watts.

Good job, Class! You are all brighter tonight! It's time for Earth Gazing. Tonight, you will continue to practice shining on the Earth and noticing new things.

- TWINKLE:** There's a stable, Silver! Maybe they can sleep there! But how can I tell them about it?
- SILVER:** Shine your light on it, Twinkle! They can follow the light!
- TWINKLE:** 100 Watts just isn't enough! I'll give it all I got. You help too!
- MARY:** This street seems to be well-lit, Joseph. Let's try the Inn here.
- JOSEPH:** It does seem to be brighter than the rest of town. We'll try it!
- INNKEEPER:** Don't you know that all the Inns in Bethlehem are full?
- JOSEPH:** Please, sir. My wife is near her time, and we need a place to stay. Any place will do!
- SILVER:** You must be putting out at least 500 Watts, Twinkle! We're getting brighter and brighter! Stars! Can you help shine on that stable over there? If we shine enough light on it, maybe they'll realize it's empty!
- GOLD:** Brighter, Stars! We can do it!

- INNKEEPER:** You're welcome to use the stable if you want. Why didn't I think of that sooner?

SHINY: Look at all the people coming to see him! Even the shepherds in the field are coming. Great job, Twinkle! You showed everyone the way to the King of Kings!







It is right to give our thanks and praise.


P: It is indeed right to give you our thanks and praise, O God,


